CORE LECTURES FOR PRELIMS AND MODS

Students preparing for their First Public Examination (Prelims or Mods) should attend the following lectures this term:

Mathematics and Philosophy; Physics and Philosophy; Computer Science and Philosophy: Elements of Deductive Logic and General Philosophy

Literae Humaniores: Moral Philosophy or General Philosophy, if either is their chosen option for Mods

A note on locations:

The **Radcliffe Humanities building** ("Rad. Hum." on the scheme above) has four floors, with lift access to all floors. The rooms chiefly used by Philosophy for classes and lectures are the Ryle Room (1^{st} floor) and the Lecture Room (2^{nd} floor). Other rooms sometimes used are the Colin Matthew Room and Meeting Room 4 (both ground floor) and the Seminar Room (3^{rd} floor). Please check the electronic display board in the lobby to confirm the room before attending.

The **Examination Schools** ("Schools") is a major site for University lectures. It is found at 75-81 High Street. Electronic screens showing the location of lectures and classes are found in the lobby of the building.
