<sup>2</sup> The two routes both cover the syllabus of General Philosophy. Route A approaches the topics via readings from Descartes, Locke and Hume; route B by a variety of classic contemporary readings. Students need only attend one of the series, but are strongly encouraged to attend both.

<sup>3</sup> Lectures for Philosophy in the Supplementary Subject in History and Philosophy of Science, an optional paper in the natural sciences schools, are listed at the end of this section. The History lectures for this option are normally offered in Michaelmas Term.

<sup>4</sup> These lectures cover both topics on applied ethics for the 103 Ethics paper and the topics for the new paper 128 Practical Ethics (which will be first examined in 2018).
